MN CHAP - COVID-19 Housing Assistance

Who is eligible? Households must meet all of the following criteria:

- o Be a Minnesota resident
- Be a renter or homeowner
- Have an <u>income at or below 300%</u> of federal poverty guidelines. Preference will be given to those at or below 200%.

- Have an eligible past due expense that is incurred between <u>March 1 and December 30, 2020</u>.
- Be <u>unable to make the payment(s) owed because of COVID-19</u> including unemployment, illness, or another COVID-19 related issue.

What expenses may be eligible? Eligible expenses are past due bills that must be paid in order to avoid displacement from your home including:

- Rent payments
- Mortgage payments (including home insurance and property taxes in certain circumstances)
- Contract for deed payments
- Manufactured home park lot rents
- Manufactured home payments
- Utility payments
- Association fees
- Additional housing related costs approved by Minnesota Housing

How will housing assistance payments be processed? If you are eligible, qualifying funds will be paid directly to the entity whom you owe rent or mortgage to (landlord, leasing agent, mortgage owners/servicer, contract for deed vendor/seller, utility company, manufactured home park owner) or any other identified entity to which payment for the direct financial assistance is owed. Assistance cannot be paid directly to households and landlords cannot apply on behalf of tenants.

Other information you may find helpful!

Communicate with your Landlord If you are struggling to pay rent, or will have this problem soon, here are some tips for communicating with your landlord.

- Talk to your landlord right away when the problem occurs.
- **Be honest** with them about your current income situation. How has the spread of COVID-19 impacted your work?
- **Consider discussing** the resources/assistance types that you've sought thus far.
 - **Explain how vulnerable your family will be**. How many members of the family will be impacted by the loss of housing?
- **Find out what other people in similar positions are doing** with this landlord or with others. Discuss the Minnesota Multi Housing Association's 'shelter in place' quidelines.
- Ask about payment arrangements. Your landlord is likely experiencing a
 high degree of stress and concern over the current circumstances as well.
 Strive to ensure that your communication with them is as clear and calm as
 possible. Document your conversations.

If you are being Evicted call Legal Services of Northwest Minnesota at 1-800-450-8585

- Currently, you cannot be evicted if you remain in the property after a notice of termination of lease, after a notice of non-renewal of a lease, after a material violation of a lease, after the termination of the redemption period for a residential foreclosure, or for <u>nonpayment</u> of rent.
- Landlords cannot issue notices of termination of lease or try to kick you out at this time.
- You are still responsible for all rent due and accrued during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- You **can** be evicted if you seriously endanger the safety of others, damage the property, or commit certain crimes on the property.
- This information may change at any time. You should call Legal Aid or your local CAP agency if your landlord tries to get you to move out.
