More information will be sent out closer to the date.


COLA 7-12 Picnic & Field Day

COLA's Parent Committee



Grades 6-8: Little Eagle was in the lead. Next Duckwater in second followed by Cherokee Middle School.


Grades 9-12: Shoshone Bannock led the way with Circle of Life Academy taking second and Northwest HS rounded out the top three.
